MAIN CHARACTERISTICS

Elegant and functional, this room can be divided into two separate spaces for parallel sessions. High quality finishings and furniture throughout the room with soundproof and sound-absorbing beech wood walls and cherry wood floors. Tiered seating is arranged in a semi-circular lay out around the stage. The standard, ready to go configurations make your event a guaranteed success. The room is fitted with comfortable Frau upholstered lecture chairs with incorporated power sockets. The room is located on the first floor.

• Soundproof and sound-absorbing full height beech wood partition walls can divide the room into 2 separate spaces

- Dimmer lights for selected areas
- Semi-circular 115 m2 stage with access from seating area and changing rooms
- Backstage area with changing rooms and restrooms

The origin of the name

The Anfiteatro Hall takes its name from the ancient Roman amphitheatre built under the rule of the Emperor Hadrian (II century A.D.) to host gladiator combats. The remains of the building were brought to light in the 19th century: only a small part of the massive structure with an elliptical floor plan that held up to 15,000 spectators on its steps and whose arena was not much smaller than that of the Coliseum. The view of the city from those very steps at that time was rather different to the modern panorama: on one side lay the populated area, on the other, the river Ausa flowing down to the port and the nearby coast.
